Dear Ms. Caissie,

This letter is in response to a letter addressed to Commissioner Brenda Lucki, dated June 18th, 2018. Your concerns were forwarded to the Commanding Officer of "J" Division RCMP, who in turn re-directed to the attention of the Officer in Charge of "J" Division Southeast District. In a second letter addressed to Commissioner Brenda Lucki, dated July 10th, 2018, you mentioned that Christopher James [REDACTED] had full authority to speak about and address this issue on your behalf.

Inspector Sylvain Leclerc (Insp. Leclerc) and Staff Sergeant Benoit Jollette (S/Sgt. Jollette) attempted to communicate with you on this issue, however you were unreachable. Insp. Leclerc and S/Sgt. Jollette were able to communicate on several occasions with Mr. [REDACTED] both by telephone and by multiple emails. Following these communications, I am now ready to address your concerns.

In your letter to the Commissioner, dated July 10th, 2018, you mentioned that "On July 4th, 2018, multiple officers under your command have now trespassed due to corrupt court actions initiated by multiple lawyers over many years causing enormous wrong and harm with now the destruction of my property". The actions referenced in your statement were recorded in the RCMP Police Reporting and Occurrence System file number 2018812659. Upon review of this file, it was learned that several members of the RCMP attended a property in the Grande Digue, NB area on July 4th, 2018. The members of the RCMP were present to maintain the peace in accordance with an Order and Injunction of the New Brunswick Court of Queen's Bench.

Insp. Leclerc and S/Sgt. Jollette advised Mr. [REDACTED] that the court ruling was a civil matter, dealing with land titles and not a criminal matter. Police had attended the disputed property in Grande Digue on July 4th, 2018, to maintain the peace only. Mr. [REDACTED] was advised that if you or anyone has issues with a civil court ruling they must consult with that court for options regarding appeals or revisions, or seek legal council to assist them in their inquiries. The RCMP cannot interfere with civil court proceedings.


In subsequent conversations with Mr. [REDACTED], he reported that there were other items at issue. Mr. [REDACTED] claimed that there was fraud against the court, referencing the Court Order and Injunction. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that the Court Order and Injunction rendered, leading to police involvement on July 4th, 2018 was done on false pretences. Mr. [REDACTED] claimed that witnesses in the court process had lied and defrauded the court, leading to a false ruling. In turn this false ruling led to theft of your property. Mr. [REDACTED] continued by stating that several lawyers have been lying about this matter for years.

Mr. [REDACTED] mentioned in his correspondence and in conversations with Insp. Leclerc and S/Sgt. Jollette that he believed that Mr. Anthony Allman should be contacted in support of these claims. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that Mr. Allman is a Crown prosecutor in the Moncton area and has knowledge of this issue. S/Sgt. Jollette contacted Mr. Allman on April 8th, 2019. Mr. Allman stated that he is retired and cannot comment on this matter.

I have given careful consideration to your matter and based on my review, it is my position that this is not a police matter, but something you may wish to pursue through civil action if you so choose. The RCMP's involvement in this matter was very limited in scope and in support of maintaining the peace pursuant to a court order.
